Set in the magical riverside gardens of Quenington Old Rectory near Cirencester, this Sculpture Biennale has become an important event on the cultural calendar. Fresh Air 2009, the ninth biennale, is curated by Lucy Abel Smith and Anna Bianchi and showcases emerging artists as well as documenting the work of some of the more established sculptors.

The quintessential country gardens of the Old Rectory form the perfect backdrop for the visitor to encounter sculpture and installations. Over ninety artists are represented this year. The audience is invited to wander through the gardens in their own time. Stewards will be on hand to answer questions.
